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

#### Respondents per country




# Characteristics of trans respondents surveyed

- ➤ Are on average young, with 7 out of 10 respondents younger than 40 years old
- > Are just as often well- as less- educated.
- > 75% is single
- ➤ Tend to fall into the lower income quartile more often than the LGB groups in survey
- > Describe their sexual orientation as bisexual or gay, or use different terms
- > Live more often in an urban area
- > 16% has a child in the household

## 1. Discrimination


• 54% all respondents say that in the year preceding the survey they felt personally discriminated against or harassed because of being perceived as trans.

• Those who felt <u>discriminated</u> against or <u>harassed</u> in the 12 months preceding the survey for being trans are more prone to avoid <u>expressing</u> their preferred gender than those who did not feel discriminated against or harassed - **60% vs 40 %.** 

## **Employment**


- Over 1 in 3 trans

- Trans women are the most likely to have felt discriminated against, followed by trans men.
- Large national differences

The job where I transitioned I was fully out as trans. I was dismissed from my job one week before I had a hysterectomy (...). In subsequent jobs I have not been out at work because of this experience.

## 3. Education

Experienced negative comments or conduct because of being trans, by identity group (% often and always)




- 79 % of the trans
   respondents were <u>never</u>
   <u>open about being trans</u>
   during their schooling
   before the age of 18.
- 82 % of the respondents state that they <u>often or</u> <u>always hid or disguised</u> <u>being trans</u> at secondary school.

## 4. Healthcare

## Experiences when using or trying to access healthcare services as a trans person (%)




- Up to 30 % of respondents who sought help for being trans experienced a situation where a healthcare practitioner wanted to help but lacked information.
- Around 1 in 5 felt personally discriminated against by healthcare or social service personnel

Question: Have you ever experienced any of the following situations when using or trying to access healthcare services as a trans person?




#### 5. Violence and hate crime

# Trans respondents' perception of perpetrators of hate-motivated violence and threats (%)

Was the perpetrator alone?	In %
Alone	37
More perpetrators	63

Family/household member	9
Someone from school, college or university	11
Someone else you know	13
Member of an extremist / racist group	14

- 1 in 3 trans respondents experienced violence or was threatened with violence in the five years preceding the survey.
- 46 % stated that the last incident of violence happened in <u>a street</u>, <u>square</u>, <u>car park or other public</u> <u>places</u>.
- Trans women, male cross dressers and transgender respondents are the most affected groups.

### Reporting violence and hate crime



• Only 1 in 4 most serious incidents of violence was reported to the police by the respondents.


#### Respondents didn't report because:

- The police would not do anything.
- Fear of a homophobic or transphobic reaction from the police

Workplace anti-discrimination policies referring to gender identity	77	5	4
Measures implemented at school to respect transgender people	93	2	5
Public figures in politics, business, sports, etc. speaking openly in support of transgender people	92	3	5
National authorities who promote the rights of transgender people	94	2	5
Better acceptance of differences in gender identities by religious leaders	92	2	6
