


10 years of Kyrgyz transadvocacy on 1 slide

- 2007 transpeople exists but there's no any assistance, obstacles for legal gender recognition because of juridical collision: necessity of the "certificate of established standard" in absence of that "standard";
- 2008 first ally medical professionals;
- **2009-2010** working group under the Ministry of Health: protocol of psychiatric examination appeared;
- 2010 the coup in Kyrgyzstan and stagnation in transadvocacy;
- **2015** transadvocacy: reloaded;
- **2016** new working group under the Ministry of Health...

January 18th, 2017

Kyrgyz Minister of Health signed a decree № 42 approving the "Manual on providing of medical and social care for transgender, transsexual and gender nonconforming people for medical professionals of all levels of Kyrgyz Republic healthcare system and other institutions".



Manual...

- Is based on WPATH Standards of Care, 7;
- Contains clinical protocol for mental health professionals and guidelines on hormone therapy;
- Raises questions of care for transgender children and adolescents, reproductive health issues, retransition;
- Forms new professional vocabulary.

Manual...

- Promotes medical and social assistance affirming gender identity;
- Protects people from requirements of surgical interventions;
- Protects people from unreasonable and expensive medical examinations;
- Contains the approved "certificate of established standard" necessary and sufficient for the legal gender recognition without additional requests.

"When I learned that the Manual were approved, I could not believe that this has finally happened here in Kyrgyzstan. I wanted to cry with happiness ... Trans*people of my country will now be able to change their documents without any hindrances, and to live better and more secure lives! This is a huge breakthrough for trans*movement on the post-Soviet space!"

New challenges...

- Manual is waiting for publication and practical implementation;
- Endocrinologists and other specialists need education;
- Political situation in general is unstable in the country;
- "Anti-LGBT" legislation is still waiting for the consideration in parliament;
- Any changes in authority are equal to changes in policies.
