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WELCOME ADDRESSES

Welcome Address from the EPATH President

Dear colleagues,

It is a great pleasure to welcome you to the 5th EPATH meeting entitled "Strengthening the standards: communities and research", on behalf of the EPATH Board, and the Scientific Committee. The title of this conference – never chosen lightly - hints at the need to devote our scientific attention towards the quality of our work, to the need for evidence, for standards in care, but also to the need to strengthen our communities: our communities as researchers, as clinicians, and also our trans communities. Today, we all are in some way or another experiencing pressure, whether it be institutional, political, societal or personal, from many different angles. We witness a rise of anti-gender and anti-trans voices, legislation, policies and movements. In the light of anti-woke tendencies, gender has become one of the entry points to criticise our daily work and research. As researchers and clinicians, criticism is a valuable tool for improvement of our practices an standards. True scientific development needs debate and constructive criticism to develop. But the difference between freedom of speech and scientific debate is not to be taken lightly.

EPATH is founded for and aims at: to gather European, international and local experts, to addresses key issues in our field, and to be an exciting forum for discussion, learning and networking. The EPATH Board and the Scientific Committee are there for very thankful for all of you who submitted an abstract, in fact we had the highest number of abstracts submitted ever. Abstracts for all oral, posters and workshops submissions went through double blind peer review process by our Scientific Committee. 98% of abstracts were accepted, based on the quality of their submitted scientific research. This also meant we had to expand our conference with an extra morning slot of parallel sessions. In total, the EPATH programme features a total of 227 presentations. It fills our hearts with joy to see the scientific community so eager to discuss their work with colleagues.

In our opening lecture, we welcome Jon Arcelus, co-chair of the SOC8, to an indepth exploration of the SOC-8 methodology, and compare the SOC-8 to other clinical guidelines. Having an understanding as to how the recommendations of the SOC-8 have been developed will allow us to critically appraise the

recommendations from the SOC-8. Our first plenary session, 'The Year in Review' will give you a synoptic review of notable recent literature in various subspecialities of transgender health: mental health adults, mental health children & adolescents, endocrinology, surgery, social and political sciences, reproductive health, voice and communication, and law, politics, and ethics. Approaching transgender health, as you can see, needs all of these disciplines (and more) as 'health' is referring to mental, physical *and* social health. Our second plenary session 'Transgender Health Care in Europe' presents you the health care situation in Eastern Europe and Central Asia (EECA) region, Iceland, the UK, and the Czech Republic. This recurrent part of the EPATH conference allows countries from different parts of Europe to share clinical services and practices for transgender care.

As during the previous editions, and in line with good governance arrangements, all attendees, speakers, sponsors and volunteers at the conference, are required to agree with our Code of Conduct. We expect cooperation from all participants to help ensure a safe environment for everybody. The code of conduct can also be found at www.epath.eu.

We are confident that EPATH 2023 will once more, strongly reflect the mission of EPATH: to foster the European knowledge and skills in transgender care, to facilitate and extend the bonds between European countries in transgender care and to spread the results of research and experiences by publishing reports and organizing scientific conferences and meetings and to collaborate with international organisations with the same or related aims.

Hopefully before or after the conference, you have time to discover county Kerry and fall in love with its beauty, as we did. We are pleased to see that the distance and travel challenges did not stop you to attend this conference, and we are so thrilled to welcome the more than 500 attendees from 29 countries here present today. Your time and effort is highly appreciated. To also strengthen our bonds, as well as to support our communities who are under pressure, we decided to organise a funrun. We hope that many of you will take part and discover the beautiful park around Muckross House and Gardens. All the profit will got to Trans Kerry, the local trans organisation.

Allow me to end with a personal note. As one of the founding board members, and now in my last days as your president, I wish to remind all of our EPATH members and conference attendees, that the aims of EPATH have always been, and will always be, to support *scientific* and *professional* interaction among *all fields* in transgender health. We have always approached health in its broadest sense: not just physical health, but also mental and social health and wellbeing.

As a social scientist I am very happy to see many fellow social scientists, anthropologists, legal scholars, and ethicists to join us in these scientific debates and as such improve interdisciplinary knowledge building. I hope to see this also in the future evolutions of EPATH: that we can stand strong together, and keep the ability to truly listen to, engage with, and learn from each other.

We hope you enjoy the conference and consider EPATH 2023 as a valuable contribution to your professional development. We thank our sponsors for their financial support, TENI, our Irish hosts of this Conference, for their collaboration, and all the volunteers who help make this conference a reality.

Number 3 was a hardware shop and agricultural supply store, number 4 was a grocer's, and number 5 was a bakery and flour merchant, now all together named J.M. Reidys. You won't find flour stored or horses stabled in J. M. Reidy's anymore, but you will have the opportunity to explore the history and enjoy a unique building that will take you back in time, in the heart of Killarney.

Participation in the social dinner and event is not included in the registration fee for the EPATH Conference, an additional registration and registration fee of €75 is required. Registration is possible through epath2023.exordo.com/login.

We expect all conference participants to behave and to use language that is respectful, non-pathologising and consistent with human rights standards, taking into account its shifting and complex contextual and cultural character. Ultimately this caution applies equally to transgender health and all other formal and informal settings in which human interaction takes place. Please refer to our Language Policy at www.epath.eu/language-policy.

We are committed to providing a harassment-free conference and training experience for everyone, regardless of gender, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, or religion. Harassment of participants, speakers, staff or volunteers in any form will not be tolerated.
