Welcome Address from the EPATH president

Dear EPATH 2025 attendees,

On behalf of the EPATH Board and the Scientific Committee, I am pleased to warmly welcome you at our 6th EPATH biennial conference in Hamburg, Germany, entitled „*Cutting Through the Noise: Evidence-Driven Transgender Care*“.

It was 10 years ago that we had our first conference edition in Ghent, Belgium, so we are reaching a milestone. Some of you might remember that first edition, where we met in the beautiful old university buildings of Ghent for the first time with a focus on European transgender care and research. During these past 10 years, transgender care has rapidly received growing attention, involving an increasing number of clinicians working in ever more countries and regions around Europe to serve the vastly extended and more visible community of transgender and gender diverse persons, young and old.

Meanwhile, research around the topic has also grown, as is exemplified by the large number of high-quality abstract submissions for this EPATH conference edition. We already experienced this at our last conference in 2023, in Killarney, Ireland. Within this context it seems ever more important to meet each other here in Hamburg. Again we connect to focus on the goals of EPATH and foster our knowledge and skills in transgender care, facilitate and extend the bonds between European countries and the world around us and spread the results of research and clinical expertise.

This year for the first time, we organize a pre-conference clinical training day for those who come to learn and enrich their clinical skills. We hope it will meet the expectations, and we will evaluate whether to repeat this in next editions!

At the core of our endeavor, we are proud to present for you an excellent conference program involving all main aspects of transgender care as well as presentations with a focus on legal, ethical and sociological topics. The number of submissions outreached the space we could offer showing the high level of quality of the program. After 10

years, EPATH has become ever more professional and provides a solid place of scientific exchange on transgender care in Europe.

Apart from the scientific exchange, we hope and expect that the conference will not only again increase our knowledge and skills on transgender care, but will also strengthen our spirits and souls to continue our work in these current challenging political times.

Gender-affirming products and their importance for trans health*

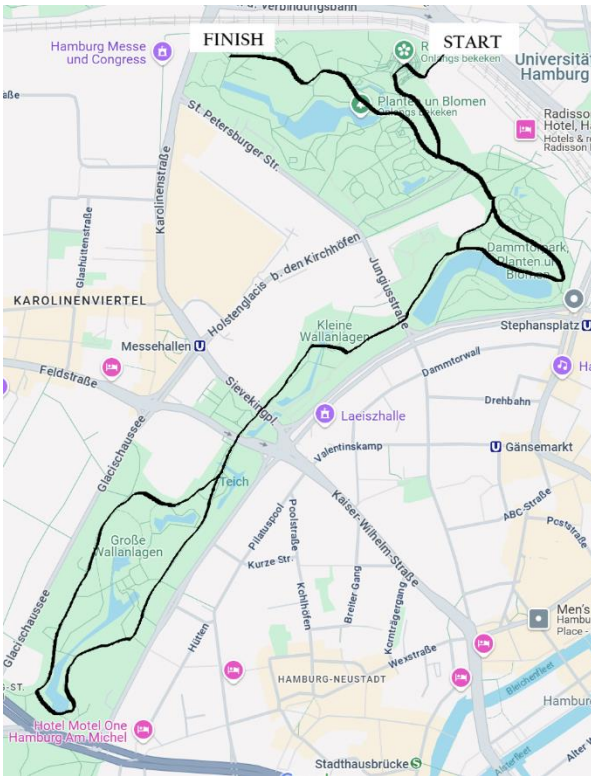
